### CONDITIONS

### The following conditions apply:

### a. INDIVIDUALS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE FULLY VACCINATED IF:

- i. They have completed both doses of the approved COVID-19 two dose vaccine regime or have received the single dose Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine.
- ii. The vaccine has been approved by the Ministry of Health, Wellness and New Health Investment and World Health Organization (WHO).
- iii. Second dose of vaccine (not applicable to the Johnson & Johnson vaccine) has been received more than two weeks prior to travel to Dominica.

### b. INDIVIDUALS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE UNVACCINATED IF:

- i. They have received a vaccine which has not been approved by the Ministry of Health and World Health Organization.
- ii. They have only received one dose of a two-dose vaccine regimen.
- iii. They have only received one dose of a two-dose vaccine regimen or two weeks have not elapsed since their second dose or single dose 1/1 series of Johnson and Johnson.

## CONDITIONS

### **APPROVED VACCINES**

- i. AstraZeneca
- ii. Pfizer
- iii. Moderna
- iv. Johnson & Johnson
- v. Sinopharm
- vi. Abdala
- vii. Soberana
- viii. Sputnik

Further vaccines may be added by the Ministry of Health, as approved by the World Health Organization.




## CONDITIONS

## VALIDATION OF VACCINATION CERTIFICATES WILL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- a. Proof of documented evidence issued by a hospital, medical center, a national public health organization or pharmacy.
- b. Vaccine certificates are to be presented in English.

Persons who fail to provide valid proof of vaccination shall be subjected to the protocols of unvaccinated persons.



## PROTOCOLS FOR PERSONS WHO ARE FULLY VACCINATED

### **PRE ARRIVAL:**

- Travellers will no longer be required to fill and submit the pre-travel form online.
- Vaccinated travellers must present proof of vaccination to airlines or other travel carrier prior to boarding and upon disembarkation in Dominica.

### **DISEMBARKATION:**

- The requirement for pre-arrival testing and testing on arrival for vaccinated travellers at all ports of entry, to include seafarers and yachters, has been removed.
- Children 12 and under will assume the status of parents or guardian.
- Testing on arrival for symptomatic travellers will remain in effect.
- Vaccinated travellers must present their proof of vaccination upon disembarkation in Dominica. Once vaccination proof is validated, traveller will be free to enjoy Dominica.

## PROTOCOLS FOR PERSONS WHO ARE NOT FULLY VACCINATED

## INDIVIDUALS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE UNVACCINATED OR NOT FULLY VACCINATED IF:

- a. They have no valid evidence of vaccination.
- b. They have received a vaccine which has not been approved by the Ministry of Health and World Health Organization.
- c. They have only received one dose of a two-dose vaccine regimen.
- d. Two weeks have not elapsed since their second dose or single dose or 1/1 series of Johnson and Johnson.



# DoMinica PRE ARRIVAL:

Travellers will no longer be required to fill and submit the pre-travel form online.

#### **ALL** unvaccinated travellers shall:

- Take a PCR test within 72 hours prior to arrival OR a Rapid Antigen Test within 48 hours prior to expected arrival time into Dominica;
- Rapid Antigen Test results must be from an accredited/certified facility. (No Rapid Antigen Home Test or self-administered test results will be accepted).
- Unvaccinated travellers must present Negative PCR test result from a nasopharyngeal swab taken within 72 hours prior to arrival OR Negative Rapid Antigen Test result from nasopharyngeal swab taken within 48 hours prior to expected arrival time into Dominica to airlines or other travel carrier prior to boarding and upon disembarkation in Dominica.

### **DISEMBARKATION:**

- Unvaccinated travellers must present the following upon disembarkation in Dominica: Negative PCR test result OR Negative Rapid Antigen Test results.
- Children 12 and under will assume the status of parents or guardian.
- Testing on arrival for symptomatic travellers will remain in effect.

### **Departing Passengers**

 Vehicles will only be allowed to access the airport and seaport with the driver and travellers.

### **Arriving Passengers**

- Once cleared, travellers shall depart from the port on either one of the following transportation options:
  - a. Safe in Nature-Certified taxi.
  - b. Rental transportation (Safe in Nature certification is required for Rental companies to operate at the Ports). Drivers shall be fully vaccinated.
  - c. Family/Friend pick up
    - Only the driver will be allowed entry into the Port.
    - ii. Driver must be fully vaccinated.
    - iii. Pick up only at the first roundabout immediately after the parking lot at the Douglas-Charles Airport.

### All travellers must:

- Wear face masks at all times.
- Practice good respiratory and personal sanitization.
